Dr. John Hodge

SPEAKER BIO: Dr. John W. Hodge's career has been defined by assisting students and teachers with overcoming obstacles and achieving goals. He has served as an inspirational speaker across the United States and has been a guest lecturer at Christopher Newport University, Hampton University, North Carolina A&T State University and George Washington University. Dr. Hodge is a trained facilitator for the (SREB) Leadership Initiative Modules "Leading Assessment and Instruction" and "Creating a High Performance Learning Culture", and a trained assessor and facilitator in the National Association of Secondary School Principals (NASSP) "Developing the 21st Century Principal" program.

Dr. Hodge is the president and co-founder of Urban Learning and Leadership Center (ULLC), an organization focused on student achievement and reduction of the achievement gap. He has served as a reading teacher, English teacher, AVID teacher, Assistant Principal and Associate Director of AVID Center Eastern Division. He served as Director of An Achievable Dream Academy, an inner city school that piloted many of the interventions used by Urban Learning and Leadership Center. An Achievable Dream Academy is a high performing, high poverty school that has received numerous national awards.

ABOUT THE SESSION: Join Dr. Hodge as he presents *BE THE ONE!* He will discuss how the education of America's youth is a challenging prospect when one considers the many burdens faced by impoverished children and their families. Research indicates that poverty need not be a barrier to academic excellence. As co-author of the book *Standing in the Gap*, Dr. Hodge states, "Across the nation, schools are demonstrating that it can be done: That students can reach high standards, that all children can succeed, that the gap between white and minority students, poor and affluent, can be closed." More often than not, one caring adult can make all the difference in the world. Dr. Hodge's presentation will encourage all of us to BE THE ONE!

Exploring the Challenge of Mental Health Disorders in the School Setting: What Can School Counselors Do?

Richard Van Acker

SPEAKER BIO: Dr. Richard Van Acker is an Emeritus Professor of Special Education at the University of Illinois at Chicago (UIC). Dr. Van Acker began his career in education as a high school math and science teacher. His ability to work effectively with troubled youth resulted in his becoming a teacher of students with emotional and behavioral disorders. He also worked as a child care worker in a residential treatment center for children and youth with emotional disorders. Since earning his doctorate, Rick has been engaged in teacher education at the UIC. His research explores the development of antisocial behavior in children – attempting to identify effective prevention and intervention strategies. Rick has served as president of the International Council for Children with Behavioral Disorders (a Division of the Council for Exceptional Children). Rick's research has been published in over 100 professional journal articles, book chapters, monographs and books.

ABOUT THIS SESSION: Join Dr. Acker for *Exploring the Challenge of Mental Health Disorders in the School Setting: What Can School Counselors Do?* This keynote address will explore some of the most common mental health disorders displayed by children and youth. It has been estimated that 1 in 5 students attending the public schools of our nation display a diagnosable mental health disorder. Over half of the individuals who will ever display a mental health disorder sometime in their lives will begin to show significant symptoms before the age of 14. Unfortunately, the vast majority of these students will not be identified as displaying a mental health disorder and most often will receive no appropriate services. In fact, the most common response in the school setting for the display of symptomatic behavior is punishment (despite efforts to employ positive practices in the school). Practical school-based practices and empirically supported intervention efforts will be highlighted.

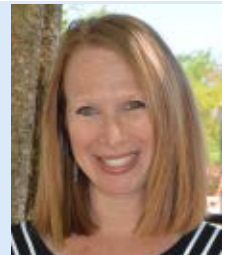

1. Teaching Growth Mindset in Schools: Mindset Matters

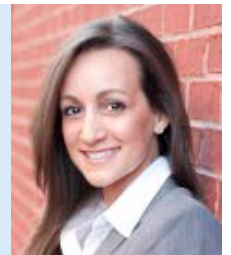


Lisa King

Lisa has previously authored many books including *Integrating Growth Mindset in Schools*, *Mindset Matters*, *Making the Link*, *Teaching Career Essentials* and *How to Create A College Day*. She is excited to present this new school counseling curriculum that incorporates Growth Mindset concepts into classroom and small group lessons. This session will review how Carol Dweck's research-based theory can be infused into your school to improve student success. Come learn about a new curriculum, Mindset Matters which uses the letters in the word MINDSET to frame your lessons: Mindfulness, Identify Brain Basics, Not Yet is OK, Determination/Grit, Self-Talk, Everyone's Unique, and Teaching Others. Since these concepts align with social/emotional, academic and career domains, you will walk away with a clear way to structure your year of lessons/groups and have student outcomes to show the success that comes from teaching about growth mindset.

She holds a Masters degree in Education and is Nationally Board Certified as an Exceptional Needs Specialist. With 21 years experience as an educator and 10 years as a professional consultant, Amie has worked with thousands of teachers, counselors and administrators in over 250 districts to improve best practices in behavior support, student engagement, and differentiated instruction. Amie has trained with Dr. Rick DuFour, Dr. Kay Burke, Dr. Spencer Kagan, Dr. Ruby Payne, and many others.
